Recycling Coordinators Marge, Warren and Tyler, have the following bits to share:

Summary of Green Bin Recyclables:

Newspaper - Place in paper bags or bundled with twine.

Magazines - Include with newspapers.

Catalogs - Include with newspapers (applies to "normal" size only; not telephone-sized ones).

Glass jars and bottles - Discard lids. Rinse.

Metal food and beverage cans - Remove lids (except for flip-top, which remain on), rinse, and place lids in bottom of can.

Corrugated cardboard - Place in paper bags or bundles no larger than 2' x 2' x 1.5'; other cardboard can be taken to recycling center on South Maple Avenue.

Junk Mail:

There is now a place to recycle "mixed paper" which includes all kinds of things: envelopes, flyers, calendars, note cards, writing paper, computer paper--all kinds of items that take up lots of room in your weekly trash bag. The Fairfax County Drop-Off Center is at the National Wildlife Federation (8925 Leesburg Pike) (where Lewinsville Road that starts out as Great Falls Street deadends at Route 7).

NOTE: For a donation to her favorite charities, the editor might be willing to do the drop off at the Falls Church Recycling Center as well as out to the NWF/FC one.

Odds and Ends - Do you have any items you never use? Are you putting off cleaning out closets because you don't know what to do with all you may find in the light of day?
