Landscape News

Flores Landscapes seems to be still doing a good job with the grass and shrubs. Complaints are way down over last year. However, the region is in the midst of a 4-year drought and Flores is not responsible for watering the lawns and trees. With over a month of little or no rainfall, the grass is parched, the shrubs are showing the strain of drought and the trees continue to suffer.

Please, Please, Please, water your lawns, shrubs and trees. Watering is best done in the morning, but if evening is the only time you can do it, fine. The shrubs need a good soaking at least once a week. Letting your hose run slowly under the canopy of the plant to ensure that its roots get a good watering is the best method. A large tree could use an hour or more of such watering once a week.

Drought affects our trees most severely, although it takes a long time to show up. The decline in some of our trees over the past year or two is from the effects of the drought over the past 3-4 years. Even mature trees need a good soaking at least once a month. PLEASE water the trees!
