Yard Waste, Brush & Leaf Pickup

Yard waste collection is provided on Mondays (except holidays), the first Monday in January through the last Monday in October, to residents who receive City refuse service. Acceptable materials include grass, leaves, and trimmings too small to be placed loose at the curb. Twigs may be included, as long as they are less than 12" in length and fingersize or less in diameter. Materials must be placed in special paper and yard waste bags, available at local stores. City collection stickers (50 cents per bag) must be affixed to bags. Stickers are available at City Hall (Environmental Services and Treasurer's Office), the Community Center, and local stores. Bags must be placed at the curb by 7 a.m.

Architecture Committee

The Architecture Committee has been soliciting bids and information for the repair and maintenance on the stamped concrete driveways and walkways. The original treatment, which was a red brick color, has suffered significant fading and some damage due to lack of preventative maintenance over the years. The driveways and walkways need to be re-stained so they are all the same color and sealed to keep out salts and moisture so they will not continue to deteriorate. The committee believes that all the homes should be done at the same time to maintain a uniform color and continuity throughout Tollgate.

The committee is going to be looking at color samples and soliciting estimates during April and plans to make a recommendation to the Board at its May board meeting. The board will then address how we will be able to pay for the work. If sufficient funds are not available in the treasury, then a special meeting of tollgate homeowners may be required. We will keep you posted as plans evolve.
