Thanks for your patience during the repair and painting of the parking pads. There are still a few more driveways to complete once the weather cooperates. When at all possible, please park in the overflow parking areas instead of on the street. ARTICLE X

Section 16. No boats, trailers, campers, trucks or old cars not regularly used shall be parked in parking areas, driveways or on the streets of said subdivision.

Water, Water, Everywhere?

With the recent hurricanes and heavy rains at times, it may seem like we are getting a lot of rain, but not so. While September is 3 inches ahead of normal, July and August were way behind. As a result we have one dead newly planted Willow Oak and many other trees that are suffering. At least two of our Oak trees have "leaf scald" from lack of moisture and the two Crape Myrtles at the front entrance have a full set of flower buds that have never opened because of lack of water. Most of the trees in Tollgate have much of their roots covered by pavement, sidewalks & driveways, and as a result, they have a hard time getting enough water to be healthy. In the hot summer months, homeowners should be watering the trees in their yards for about 1 hour, twice a week.
