Local Business Spotlight

Smashburger (308 S. Washington Street, Falls Church)

As I approach middle age, I find myself thinking more about my diet and nutrition. Not a lot, mind you, but a little, which is better than not at all. I try to exercise some restraint when making my food choices—a little less red meat during the week, more fruits and vegetables whenever possible, and maybe just a medium slice of cake instead of a very large one. Gone are the days of eating an entire bag of Oreos at one time.

Unfortunately, with the addition of Smashburger to the growing stable of Falls Church restaurant establishments, my feeble attempts at restraint go right out the window. A regular burger, fries, and milkshake, all of which I recommend highly, will give you 1,950 calories of sheer gastronomical joy. Each burger, made of fresh 100% certified Angus beef, is smashed, seasoned, and seared, placed on an artisan bun, and topped with fresh produce and sauces. The fries, hand tossed with garlic, rosemary, and olive oil, are a bit greasier than I like, but very tasty nonetheless. And the handspun Haagen-Dazs milkshakes are a delicious force to be reckoned with.

Although Falls Church has other local burger joints, such as Five Guys, Elevation Burger, and Red Robin, that are quite respectable in their own right and offer up delicious burgers at a decent price, Smashburger brings this great American favorite to a new level. Like television after color, basketball after Michael Jordan, and Tollgate after wherever we lived before, once you try Smashburger, you will never want to go back to anything else.

Smashburger fashions itself as "a place with a burger soul." While that may be a bit of a stretch, this newcomer to our Little City serves up a menu that will leave your heart crying for help and your stomach calling for more!
